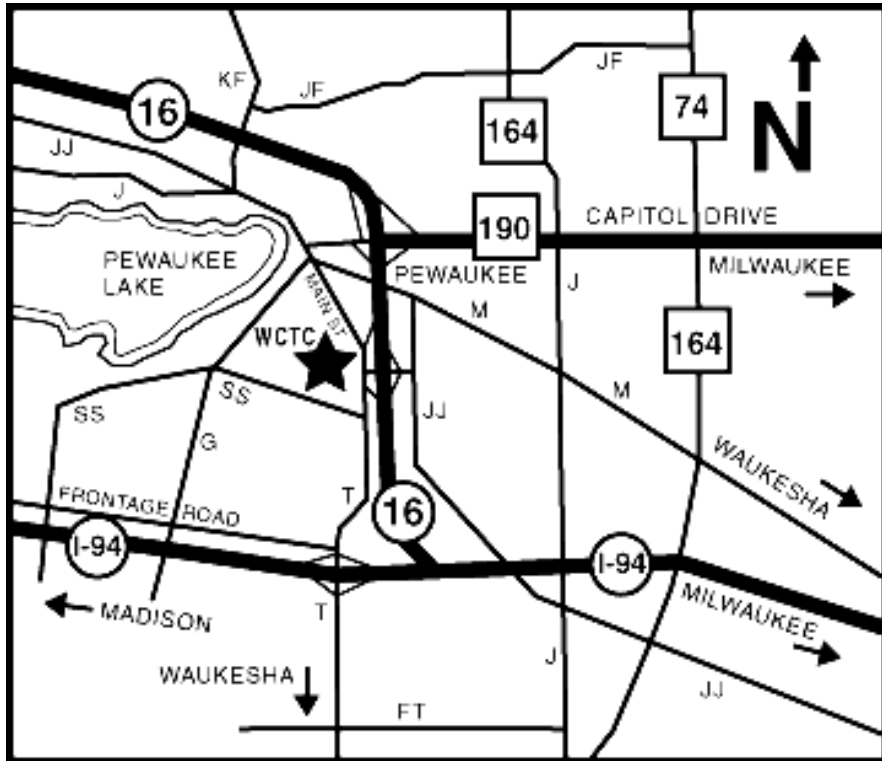

## AIS Smart Prevention Training

Smart Prevention is an aquatic invasive species (AIS) management approach developed by the Jake Vander Zanden lab at the UW-Madison Center for Limnology (CFL) to more effectively direct resources to lakes that are most vulnerable to invasion by potentially harmful, exotic species.

At this special training opportunity CFL researchers will help you gain a better understanding of how management decisions about invasive species are made, and how to apply this strategic approach to aquatic invasive species control in your community. We'll also discuss the merits of adopting a more regional approach to prevention and assess the barriers to implementing such an approach.
